As I write to you, the halls of Fordham Prep are quiet as we spend this week in remote learning. Please know of my gratitude for your patience and understanding as we continue to navigate the winter months and the latest wave of the COVID-19 pandemic. As Fr. Devron and I have mentioned in previous communications, the shift from hybrid to remote for classes is always carefully measured in light of the positivity rate in our school community and the impact of required quarantines based on the directives of the New York City Department of Health. We assure you that we will continue to communicate updates as necessary to our Prep families in a timely manner. Please carefully review our health and safety reminders found below.

In the wake of the violence at the U.S. Capitol last week, the Fordham Prep community gathered in prayer for healing and peace. HEALTH AND SAFETY

- Parents/guardians must contact Mrs. Maryann Casaccio-Ortiz at 718-584-8328 if their son is absent due to illness. The school nurse will follow up with a phone call home.
- Please refer to our <u>VitalCheck FAQ</u> if you have questions about protocols for reporting COVID-19 symptoms.
- If a parent/guardian answers "yes" to any of the questions on the VitalCheck daily questionnaire, the student must remain home for at least three days or otherwise be cleared with a doctor's note ruling out COVID-19 (e.g, cough is due to chronic asthma), or a negative COVID-19 PCR test result. If a student experiences COVID-19 symptoms due to another cause about which you have certitude (e.g., a headache caused by diagnosed migraine condition; sore muscle due to sports injury), it is not necessary to report this on VitalCheck.
- As per our <u>reopening plan</u>, students who are ill will not be allowed to return to school until they have met CDC criteria to discontinue home isolation for COVID-19 and non-COVID-19 related illnesses which include three days with no fever, an illustration that symptoms have been improved, and ten (10) days elapsed since the symptoms first appeared.
- Students are reminded to keep six feet of physical distance at all times traveling to and from school, walking on Fordham University campus, and throughout the Prep building. Specifically, throughout the Prep campus: do not crowd around each other in the Commons and other large spaces. Do not shake hands. As we are all aware, COVID-19 is asymptomatic, which is why physical distance is so important. We are asking every student to do his part in preventing its spread.
- All students are strongly encouraged to get a flu shot at their primary doctor or a health clinic if they have not yet done so.
- On our <u>COVID-19 dashboard</u>, you may find data about the daily and weekly status of COVID-19 positivity within our community.

- Virtual Parent-Teacher Meetings are currently scheduled to take place on Tues 2/2. More information will follow in a separate email communication closer to the date.

ATHLETICS


- For the winter season, the following sports have been given approval to practice and host competitions: indoor track and field, swimming and diving, and bowling.

CAMPUS MINISTRY AND SERVICE

- The **Great Ignatian Challenge** broke records this year with over 46,000 pounds of food donated placing the Prep in a tie for 1st among 9 schools in money awarded from donor, Jim Rowen '82. Thank you to all who gave so generously to those in need this year.

- Emmaus retreats for juniors have been scheduled for 2021. Sign ups will be made available after break. They will take place at the Prep and social distancing guidelines will be followed. Emmaus 301 for seniors has been rescheduled for January.
- School-wide virtual prayer services celebrating the Immaculate Conception and Advent have continued to help the community stay spiritually in the liturgical season while also celebrating the service projects of the Class of 2021.
- **Christian Service Immersion:** A heartfelt thank you to all who wrote cards to our friends associated with Appalachia Habitat for Humanity and the Children's Center of the Cumberlands in our first-ever Christmas card initiative. We hope we will be able to once again travel in 2021 as part of our Christian Service Immersion Program, with a decision regarding any travel expected by the end of March.

COLLEGE COUNSELING

- Students should continue to update admission decisions in Naviance when they are received. The College Counseling Office will automatically send a mid-semester grade report for all applications for which we do not have a final admission decision when grades become available in late January. We kindly ask all parents/guardians to assist their sons in providing college decision information to the College Counseling Office.
- Seniors were emailed instructions for signing up for a new Schoology course, "2021 College Counseling". All seniors are asked to sign-up for this course as college counselors will utilize this course to communicate with seniors during the second semester.
- Has your son been awarded a scholarship from a college, university or outside organization? If so, please submit a copy of the award letter to Mrs. Isabel. Letters can be emailed to isabelc@fordhamprep.org or faxed to 718-367-9090.
- College Prep guidance for juniors starts on Wed 1/20. Students will meet in small groups with their college counselor during their currently scheduled Guidance class. During the first class, counselors will review the course syllabus with students and demonstrate how to sign-up for one-on-one meetings, and review features of Naviance Family Connection.
- The College Board is hosting four virtual college fairs that are designed for students to have real conversations with hundreds of colleges, admission reps, and current college students without leaving home. As Congress met to certify the 2020 electoral college vote, a protest outside the Capitol turned violent as the crowd unlawfully entered the building and temporarily disrupted the voting process. While we adults continue to process these events, kids are also trying to make sense of what they're seeing and hearing in the news and on social media. To help, CSE has put together some <u>age-appropriate questions and conversation</u> <u>starters</u> that adults can use to navigate this tricky topic with their children. CSE hopes these tools help you provide the care, comfort, and answers our kids and teens need during these challenging and unpredictable times.
