Classes are structured in tandem with students’ needs in subsequent years. Select music composition, vocal and acting classes are available beginning in freshman year.

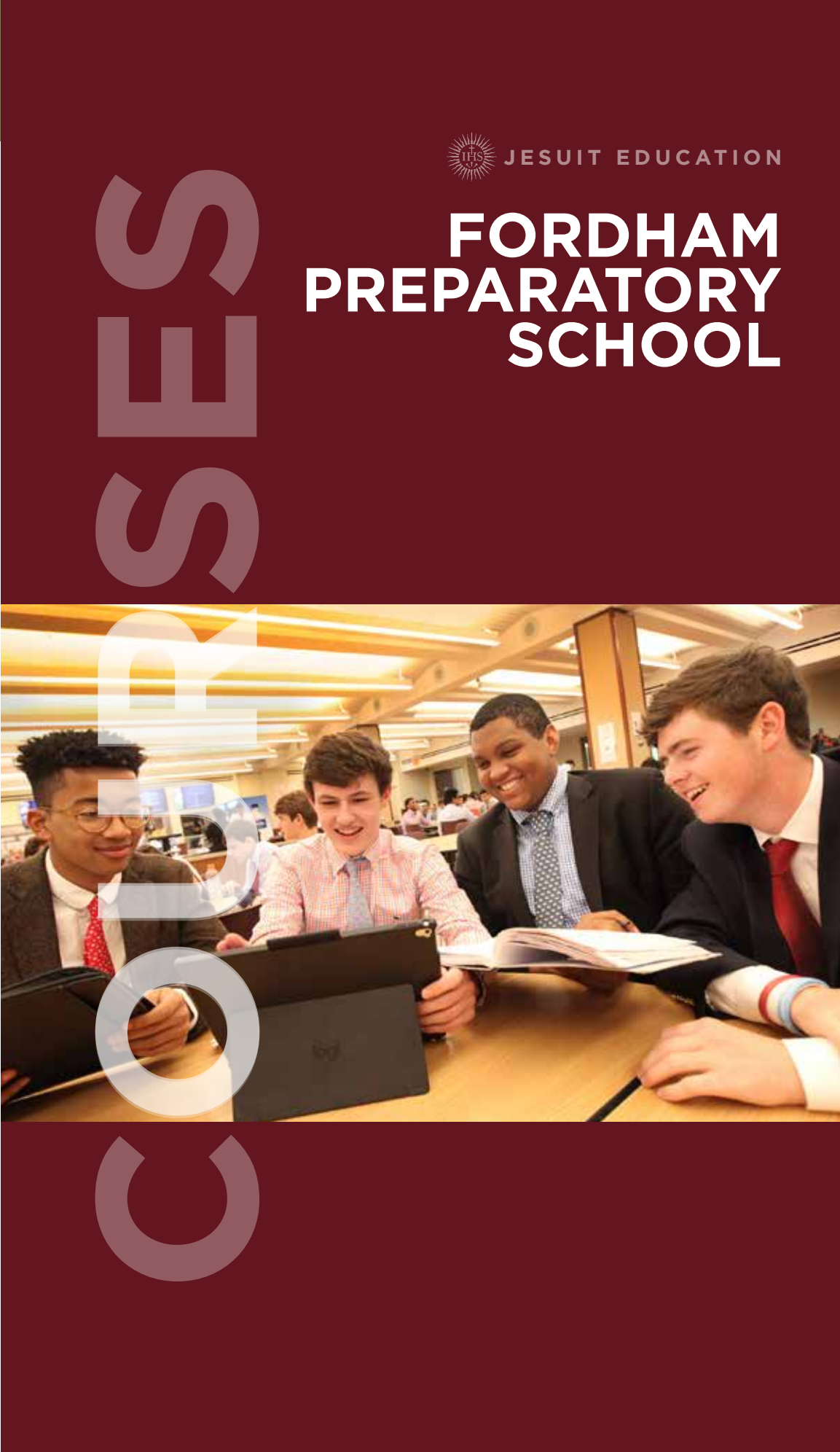
