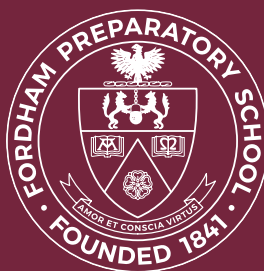

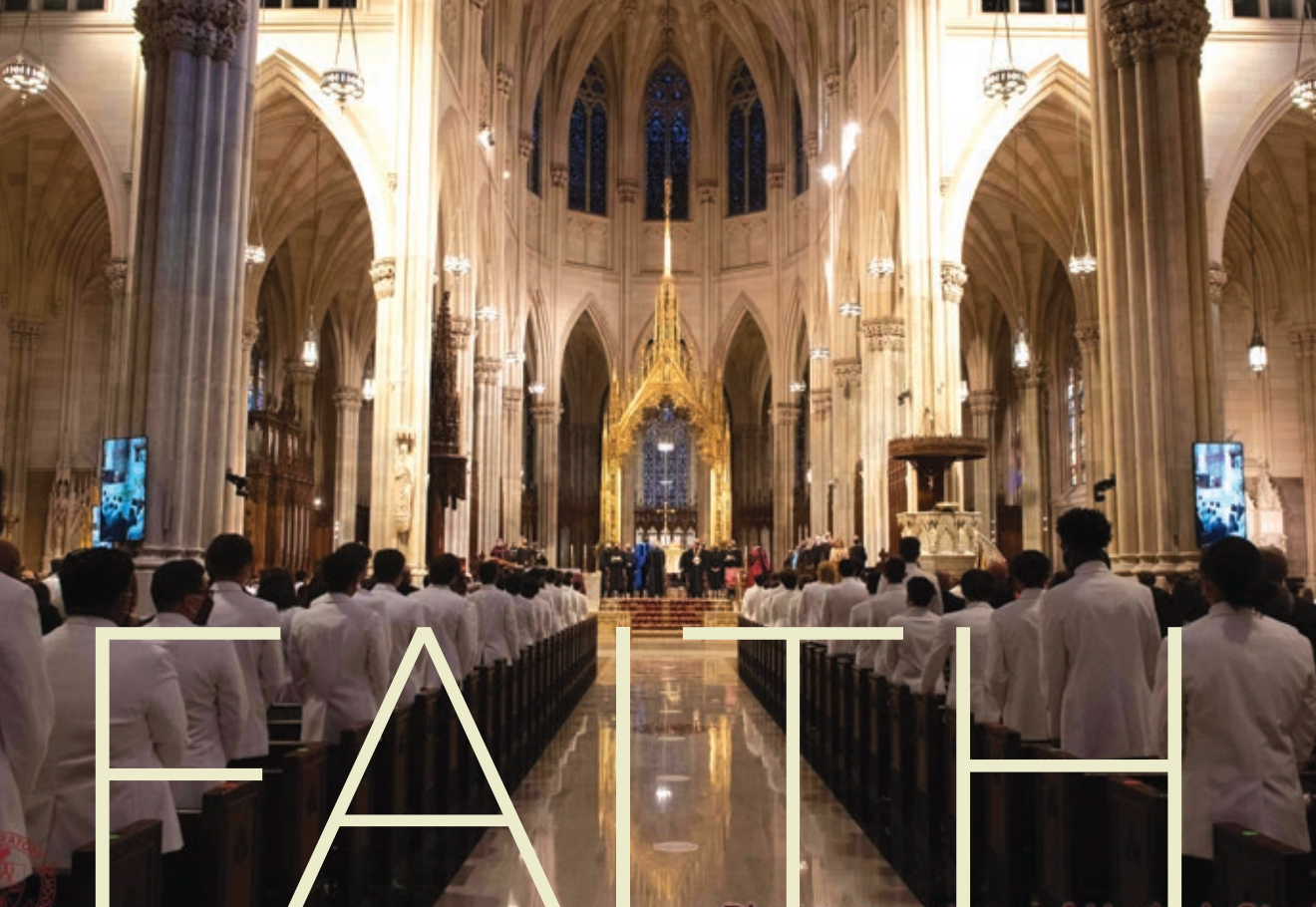

Jesuit education reflects the conviction that the study of great ideas is inextricably linked to the formation of character. Our program of studies encompasses more than the acquisition of knowledge; it fosters academic discipline and encourages reflection in the pursuit of excellence.

INDIVIDUALIZED HONORS PROGRAM

Our Individualized Honors Program focuses on **every** student's talents and gifts. This allows each student to create a schedule that reflects his unique skills and academic goals. The program includes:

- **Honors courses in freshman year**
- **21 Advanced Placement courses offered**

Latin, Computer Science A, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Art History, Music Theory, 2-D Art and Design, Calculus AB, Statistics, Chinese Language and Culture, Spanish Language and Culture, Spanish Literature and Culture, Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Physics 1, European History, Macroeconomics, United States Government and Politics, United States History, World History: Modern.

- **College classes for seniors at Fordham University**

Qualified seniors can enroll in one course per semester.

- **1-to-1 computing**

Students and teachers employ technology for continuous use in and outside the classroom allowing the community to research, learn and create at all times to become fluent in the tools of the 21st century.

- **Latin and Ancient Greek**

All students are required to take either Latin or Ancient Greek in their first year. Exposure to these languages helps students with the basic fundamentals of language itself and assists students in becoming critical readers and writers.

VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS

All students are **required to earn at least one credit**. Students can choose from classes in Acting Techniques, Architectural Drawing, Art History, Graphic Design, Music History, Studio Art, vocal and instrumental performance, and more.

Freshmen are eligible to take a class in either vocal or instrumental performance **with no experience necessary**.

There is also the option to participate in a number of co-curricular activities in order to earn the credit.

iSTEAM

Fordham Prep offers opportunities for interdisciplinary learning in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM). The program provides students the opportunity to imagine, innovate, design, create and discover in the spirit of our Ignatian identity for the purposes of social justice and finding God in all things to benefit humankind.

The “i” in iSTEAM intentionally grounds our work in the Ignatian spirit of imagination, innovation, and inquiring how to address problems to serve others and care for all creation. Topics covered include:

- **Biomedical Research**
- **Computer Science**
- **Coding**
- **Engineering**
- **Robotics**

Project-based learning and immersion experiences offer our students pathways of learning bent toward technology, engineering, sciences,

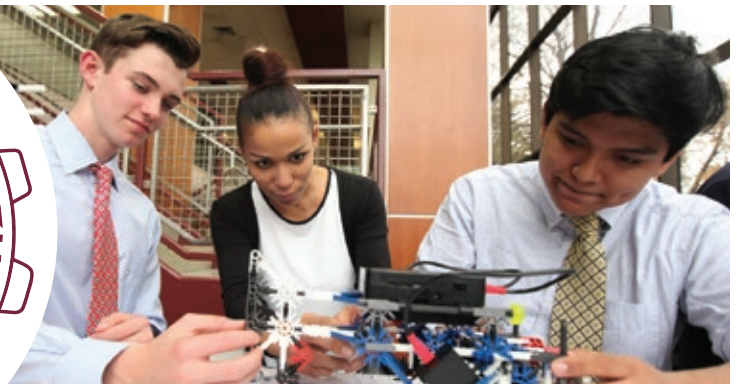
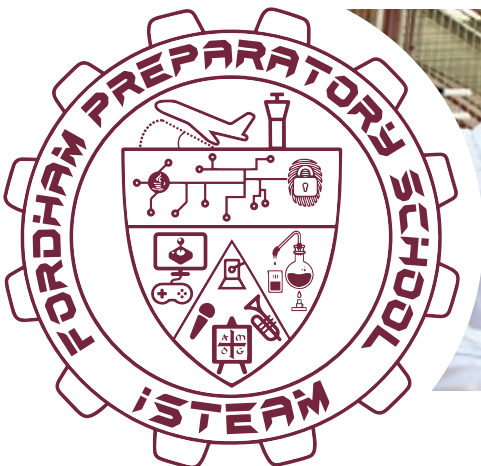
and the arts. Students also have an opportunity to conduct research and present findings during an annual campus-wide symposium.

Fordham Prep is a proud member of the International Technology and Engineering Educators Association (ITEEA).

In 2022 the Prep hosted the inaugural iSTEAM Expo that allowed students to showcase the skills they have acquired in this cutting-edge technology.

CIVICS

Part of Fordham Prep’s overall mission is to develop educated, informed and engaged citizens. It is our hope that Prep students will depart for college with a thorough understanding and appreciation of their system of government, an enhanced recognition of the importance of free speech, respect for multiple points of view, and as proponents of civil dialogue, an essential part of a healthy democracy.

Students have the opportunity to participate in the Civics program in a number of different ways including:

- **Exposure to an enhanced civics focus in the school's Social Studies curriculum including US History, AP US History, and AP Government and Politics classes**
- **Attending events and activities including National History Day and the annual Civics Symposium**
- **Participation in the school's Speech and Debate team and nomination to the National Student Leadership Conference**
- **Using new media tools to help navigate today's challenging information landscape by developing news literacy skills**

In 2022, the Prep hosted the inaugural FitzSimons Civics Symposium titled "Social Media: Good or Bad." Students spent the weeks leading up to the event studying both sides of the debate. The program culminated with professors from Georgetown and Yale leading a discussion on the topic for members of the student body.

* All students take Latin or Ancient Greek in freshman year. Thereafter, a student may continue his classical language or begin a modern language, or add a second language (classical or modern) to his classical language. In all cases, however, students must finish senior year with the equivalent of four years of a foreign language and complete at least the third level of a language.

** In most cases, students do not need permission to take a Visual & Performing Arts course as a 7th class.

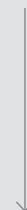

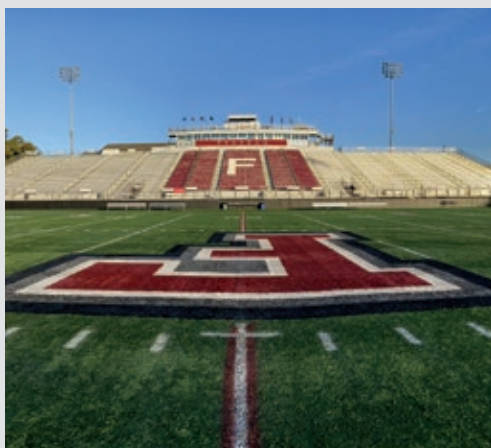

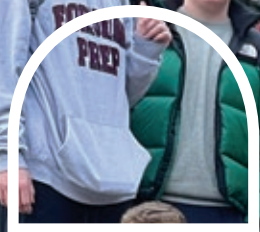

GLOBAL EDUCATION PROGRAM

Fordham Prep's Global Education Program raises student awareness of the world outside their own environment through the exploration of different and diverse cultures. The program includes exchanges with other Jesuit schools as well as academic and cultural immersion experiences.

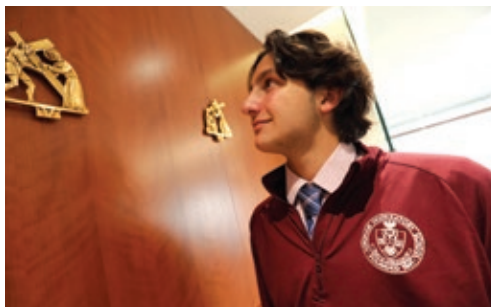

For over 180 years, Fordham Prep has made its home on the historic Rose Hill campus adjacent to Fordham University in the Bronx. Our proximity to Manhattan and other New York City boroughs makes travel convenient for academic and cultural experiences.

Fordham Prep has benefited from \$20 million in improvements over the last 10 years, including the Boller Science Center, the Rowen Athletic Field, the Joe Fox Memorial Track, renovations to the Commons and locker rooms, a new Prep Chapel, and a new lobby that includes casual spaces for students, and a college-style group work area.

In the fall of 2021, we completed our East Wing Project that renovated nine classrooms, established a new Admissions Suite, a new Counseling Center to house both our School and College Counseling staff, and created a new computer lab and maker bot space. Classrooms have been updated with state-of-the-art equipment that includes modern and flexible seating arrangements, projectors, Swivls for enhanced and remote learning, and more.

Qualified students can take classes at Fordham University and perform research at the Walsh Library. Most athletic teams use Fordham's NCAA Division 1 facilities.

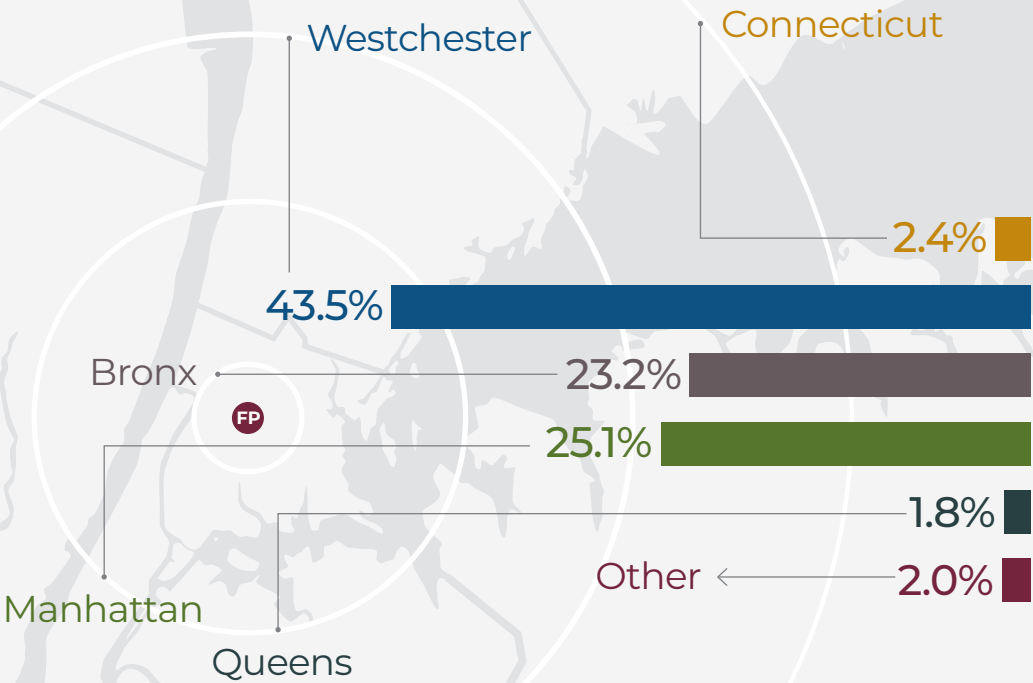

Care of the individual (*"cura personalis"*) is the cornerstone of Fordham Prep's college counseling program. The program is designed to help students and their families navigate the intricacies of the college search and college application process.

Fordham Prep also offers a comprehensive, four-year, School Counseling program for all students with daily access to a trained mental-health clinician. The program includes individual counseling, group guidance classes and support groups.

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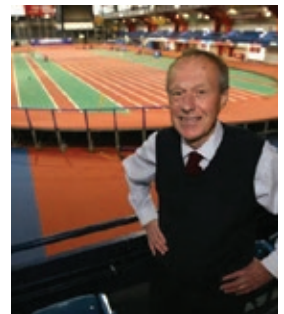


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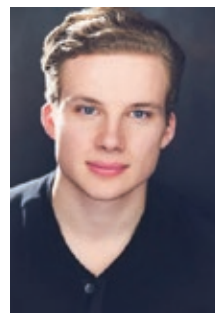
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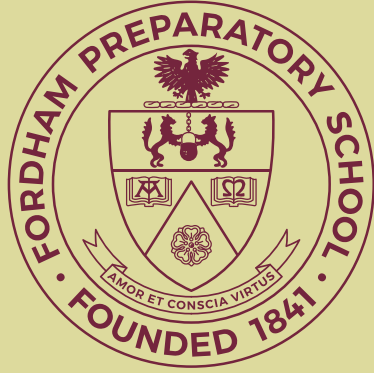
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
